# Articulation Agreement between Hudson Valley Community College, Digital Media A.S. program into the Sage College of Albany, Graphic + Media Design, BFA

## Objective

This articulation agreement is intended to facilitate the transfer of qualified students currently enrolled in the Digital Media A.S. program at Hudson Valley Community College into the B.F.A. Graphic + Media Design program at the Sage College of Albany. Counselors at HVCC can use the information in this agreement to advise current students as they express an interest in the Graphic + Media Design program as to which HVCC courses should be taken prior to application for transfer.

### Terms of Agreement

This articulation agreement, once signed will be effective immediately and must be reviewed and re-approved in the same manner at least once every two years hereafter, in order to remain in effect.

The procedures of review and re-approval shall be as follows:

The latest available catalogs of the two institutions are reviewed by the SCA Graphic + Design Program Coordinator and the revised draft is prepared by the Graphic + Media Design Program Coordinator.

A final draft is signed by the department chairs of both institutions and by the appropriate administrator of both institutions.

All of the most recently published rules for accepting transfer students into programs of SCA apply. The agreement supplements, but does not supercede or replace what was written in the latest SCA catalog.

SCA agrees to accept and transfer into the B.F.A. program up to 66 credit hours earned by the student at Hudson Valley Community College, who takes the courses listed below. Only courses of earned grades of C- or better will transfer, and the students who attain a combined Grade Point Average (GPA) of a 2.5 in courses will automatically be admitted into the SCA program.

This agreement covers courses taken at HVCC only. If students from HVCC have credits on their transcripts from other institutions, the published SCA rules for accepting transferred credit will apply to those credits.

If students from HVCC wish to transfer without having completed all of the courses in this agreement, they are assured that the identified equivalent courses with C- or better will transfer, but outright admission into the program will not be guaranteed. All transfer students must meet with a Graphic + Media Design Advisor to plan their courses and to determine how many semesters are required for degree completion. Degree completion may vary by student, according to the number of credits transferred and course scheduling. A portfolio review is also a requirement for admission.

## **APPENDIX G**

#### SUNY TRANSFER COURSE EQUIVALENCY TABLE

Proposals for programs leading to the Associate in Arts or the Associate in Science degree must include documentation that program graduates will be able to transfer into at least two registered baccalaureate programs and complete them within two additional years of full-time study. Letters from the chief academic officers of two baccalaureate institutions attesting to the articulation of the proposed A.A. or A.S. must be included with the program proposal. **These letters must assert acceptance of the completed SUNY Transfer Course Equivalency Table.** 

For at least two baccalaureate programs with which the A.A. or A.S. is meant to articulate, fill in a separate Transfer Course Equivalency Table, which appears on the following page. Each associate degree course should appear on the same row as the baccalaureate program course with which it is deemed to be equivalent. Table cells are to be filled in according to the key below:

"Course #"—Indicate the departmental identifier and course number (e.g. PHI 101).

"Course Title"—Indicate the title of the course (e.g., Introduction to Philosophy).

"Credits"—Indicate the number of credit hours granted for completing that course.

<u>"Equivalency"</u>—Indicate whether the course will count toward *General Education*, the *Major*, or *Graduation* (i.e., Graduation-only) requirements at the baccalaureate campus. (*General Education* may include but is not limited to the SUNY-GER.) If a given associate degree course will not be credited at all toward graduation by the baccalaureate institution, enter *None* in this cell.
