Stop, Jot, and Share by Norm Eng

"Stop-jot-share gets students to retain content more effectively. And it's so simple, you can use it tomorrow. Here's how it works in five steps.

1. Lecture for 10-15 minutes.
2. Then **stop**.
3. Ask students to **jot** down everything they remember.
4. Have them **share** with a partner to fill in any gaps.
5. Correct any misconceptions where necessary.

Stop. Jot. Share. Total time: no more than 5-7 minutes. Rinse. Repeat."
