- Applicants should have Initial Certification through the NYS Office of Teaching Initiatives <u>www.highered.nysed.gov/tcert/</u> If accepted provisionally into the program without Initial Certification, certification must be received before 12 credits are completed or candidate will be unable to continue until such time as certification is received.
- 2. All probationary and/or provisional conditions must be satisfied before student teaching. All courses in this Program of Study must be completed prior to student teaching. In special circumstances, one course may be taken concurrently with student teaching with the approval of your Advisor.
- 3. A 3.0 GPA and matriculation are required.
- 4. In addition to registering for student teaching, you must also complete an application. They are available in from your advisor. Your application is due on the 1st day of the semester PRECEDING the semester in which you plan to student teach. - 5. In addition to satisfying the requirements for the degree, teacher candidates must also:

 - Complete a criminal background check with fingerprinting, as required by New York State law.
