What To Know:

- This was not your fault. You are not alone.
- You have the right to choose whom you will talk to, what resources you will use, what you will say, and when you will say it.
- If you choose to share your experience, your disclosure will be taken seriously, and you will be treated with dignity.
- The College does not tolerate abuse or violence, including sexual harassment, sexual assault, intimate partner violence, or stalking.
- You will be protected from retaliation. The College does not tolerate acts of retaliation against anyone participating in an investigation.
- If you have experienced harassment, abuse or violence:



What To do:

- I. If someone tells you they have experienced abuse or violence, first respond with empathy and listen to them, offer them support, and encourage them to seek help and counseling as soon as possible.
- 2. If the individual's safety is an immediate concern, call 911 or contact Public Safety.
- **3.** Tear this card at the perforation. Keep this half for your information, and provide the other half to the individual who experienced the violence.
- Report the incident to the Title IX Coordinator listed on the back of this card in accordance with Campus policies and procedures.

- **6.** (Students) For confidential reporting, you may report to the Wellness Center or Spirituality Center.

Who Needs to Report?

Exceptions to reporting are made for employees who operate under statutorily protected confidentiality (i.e. licensed health services, campus counseling services, and sexual assault advocates). If you have questions about whether to report, please call the Title IX Coordinator.

Why You Need to Report

- To ensure the individual has access to all available resources
- To enhance campus safety
- To comply with Title IX and other federal and state laws and regulations

Tell the Individual

Read the following paragraph to a person reporting to you:

"You have the right to make a report to Public Safety, local law enforcement, and/ or New York State Police, or choose not to report; to report the incident to the College; to be protected by the College from retaliation for reporting an incident; and to receive assistance and resources from Russell Sage College."

Prohibition on Retaliation

The College prohibits retaliation of any kind. The College does not tolerate acts of retaliation against anyone for filing a complaint or participating in an investigation. Every effort will be made to protect your privacy.
